Location

Tower Place is an early 19th Century, Grade II listed terrace overlooking York's historic wall and Tower Gardens. The houses are charming and full of character, subtly tucked away between Clifford's Tower and the River Ouse. At the end of the terrace is Davy Tower, originally part of the city's defences and at one time a summer house, beyond is the river with its walkway.

York has a racecourse, two theatres and York Art Gallery, as well as, excellent schools. A number of very good restaurants have opened in recent years including Roots, The Star in the City and Skosh. The train station has regular services across the country, with many to London in under two hours. York University is considered one of the best in the country.

House and Garden

Approached through a gate down a flagged path 6 Tower Place has an appealing garden behind wrought iron railings.

The ground floor flows well with an elegant drawing room, overlooking the garden. The sitting room opens onto the kitchen/dining room. To the back of the house is the courtyard garden accessed directly from the kitchen.

The first floor master bedroom has a wonderful view over the gardens and obliquely to the river. There is a second bedroom, an attic bedroom and a shower room.

This beguiling house has been a much loved home. Whilst being beautifully presented the house requires general updating.






